CBHSNA Pony Club Recognition Program Frequently Asked Questions

Activities that are considered Pony Club Events

- 1. Mounted meetings, either with your home club, or as a visitor at other clubs, regionally or nationally.
- 2. Ratings, from D1 through A, either in your home club or another club.
- 3. Rallies: regional rallies, either in your own region or in other regions, and National Championship Rallies.
- 4. Shows or events sponsored by a Pony Club, allowable even if it is in conjunction with another organization, such as a Horse Trials or breed show.
- 5. Foxhunting, if the hunt was a Pony Club day or the hunting is done as an organized activity planned by the Club.
- 6. Other activities that the club might do together, such as parades, beach rides, competitive trail rides, non-competitive trail rides, endurance rides, geocaching, summer camp, rodeos, costume rides, overnight slumber party rides, riding in circles around the pasture, provided the club has covered the event with Pony Club insurance.

Activities that are not considered Pony Club Events

- 1. Lessons that are not part of a Pony Club sponsored (planned, organized, or insured by) mounted meeting
- 2. Breed Shows not sponsored by Pony Club
- 3. Horse Trials or 3 Day Events, not sponsored (see above) by Pony Club
- 4. Hunting as an individual
- 5. Trail Rides, both competitive and non competitive, that are not sponsored by a Pony Club.
- 6. Other activities you might do with your horse that have nothing to do with Pony Club.
